Learning and Teaching

A bilingual campus

Given the multi-ethnic and multi-cultural nature of IKTMC's intake (including Chinese, Pakistani, Indian, Nepalese, Indonesian, Arabic and African, etc), the school does place great emphasis on promoting cross-cultural understanding, respect and harmony on campus. A bilingual language policy is in force where English and/or Chinese are specified to be the medium of communication. The setting up of such a bilingual campus has benefited students a great deal. New arrival students, be it from mainland China or Southeast Asian countries, have seen substantial progress in their respective second language learning.

Support for Non-Chinese Speaking Students

Our College provides multi-dimensional support for non-Chinese speaking students in their Chinese Language learning. The strategies include:

- A school-based Chinese Language curriculum;
- Students may, based on their own proficiency level, opt for taking either the IGCSE, the GCE (A-level), or the HKDSE Chinese Language examination;
- An additional Chinese Language class is provided to each level to maximize exposure to the target language, and
- After-school Chinese Language remedial classes are offered

Support for Newly Arrived Students

Academic and non-academic programmes have been introduced to help newly arrived students get accustomed to the new life in Hong Kong. All new arrival students are eligible to join, regardless of his nationality. Examples of the programmes include:

- The introduction of Chinese Language and/or English Language enhancement lessons:
- After-school tutorials to provide additional guidance to completing assignments;
- A social skills programme;
- City-tours such as tram-rides, visiting museums and theme parks, etc.; and
- A mentorship programme.

Whole-school Approach to Integrated Education

Our College has been adopting the whole school approach to address the issue of diverse learning needs (DLN). A Student Support Team (SST) has been established in response to the Education Bureau's requirements and to the expectations expressed by the College's stakeholders. The SST is composed of the vice-principal, the SEN coordinator, subject teachers, the school social workers and the teaching assistants.

Funded by the Learning Support Grant (LSG), multifaceted learning support services have been sourced from external bodies to help those with specific educational needs. For example, services on speech therapy, on social skills training, on reading and writing skills enhancement, and on attention training have been on provision. A portion of the LSG has been utilized for recruiting teaching assistants to provide more individualized learning support.

A broad range of activities and community services has been coordinated by the SST in a bid to fulfill its goal of fostering an inclusive school environment. Meetings and assessments are, under the support from EDB's officials and school-based educational psychologists, conducted on a regular basis. Also, parents have been kept regularly informed about students' latest learning progress through an established communication mechanism.

Special arrangements for DLN students are in place when they sit for internal examinations. The school also helps those in need to apply for special examination arrangements before they take local public examinations. Information about the latest pedagogies in addressing DLN is also circulated within the teaching team from time to time.

STEM activities

The educational benefits of STEM activities to students not only lie in the enrichment of scientific knowledge, but also in building up their capacities for problem solving when they are in the course of applying their STEM knowledge to accomplish real-life tasks. STEM activities have been widely considered to be conducive for arousing learners' passion in the pursuit of knowledge, and for developing a more creative and innovative mind.

A myriad of STEM activities has been held in the 2018/2019 school year, which included VR videos making, DIY scientific models construction, the design of paper spinning tops, microbit, the design and production of sewing tools with "scan and cut" devices, projection mapping, robotics, compiling programme-codes for drones, and the design of video games with bloxels, etc. Students were also offered opportunities to showcase the STEM knowledge they acquired and learn from their rivalries through engaging in local and international STEM competitions.

E-learning

The school has strived to heighten interest in learning and optimize learning outcome through the introduction of e-learning. In a bid to actualize an ambition as such, additional iPads and tablets have been acquired over the past two years. The desk-tops in the school library, and the networking infrastructure in the two computer rooms have been upgraded. The improvements undertaken have seen more frequent use of e-learning in every-day classes.

Promotion of Reading

We believe that reading can enhance one's writing skill and ability. Therefore, our school's Library Department organizes "Morning Reading

Programme" and "Reading Star Contest" to encourage students to read more newspapers, books and other learning materials on a regular basis. In addition, students can borrow iPads from the library to read e-books as well. This year, we have brought more e-books by using the "promotion of reading grant" provided by the HKSAR government.

GCSE / GCE (AS) Examination

In the 2018/2019 school year, a total of nine IKTMC students achieved Grade A^{\star} in the Modern Foreign Language Examination (Chinese) of the General Certificate of Secondary Education (GCSE). More than 30% of IKTMC's candidates taking the GCE (AS) Chinese Examination achieved Grade B or above.

Chinese Week

The Chinese Week, held when the Chinese Lunar New Year was around the corner, had been well received. A Poster Design Competition, a Chinese Penmanship Competition, and a tongue twister contest had been run, while activities like New Year Paper Cutting and Red Pocket Decoration, the practice of Chinese Calligraphy, and tasting Chinese food were held to promote cross-cultural appreciation.

S.1 and all new arrival students had been taken for a stroll in the Chinese New Year Fair held at the Victoria Park just ahead of the fall of the Chinese New Year. The visit offered participants an opportunity for experiential learning about the customs the Chinese observe in celebrating the festival. On the other hand, S.4 students took part in the Wan Chai Cultural and Heritage Tour, in which they undertook cultural

and heritage-site exploration along Tai Yuen Street, the "Blue House" and the Lee Tung Avenue. The tour aimed at enhancing participants' understanding of the symbiotic effect of how the intermingling of traditional and modern culture could benefit the sustainable development of a local district.

Extramural learning experiences and achievements

To develop NCS students' intrinsic motivation for learning and using Chinese Language beyond regular class time, the school has been reaching out for learning opportunities through which the exposure to the target language could be maximized. Students are positively encouraged to give themselves a go to external programmes such as the Speech Festival, the Chinese Penmanship Competition, the Writing Competition, and the Chinese Drama programme. Many did manage to shine in the contests too.

Our alumni, Tahreem Fatimah and Shabnam Nigar, were awarded the *Unison Chinese Performance Scholarship for Ethnic Minority Students* in the 2018/2019 school year. To be qualified for the scholarship, an NCS student was required to secure a Grade B or above in Advanced Level Chinese of the General Certificate of Education (GCE) Examination.

Five IKTMC students had been selected to participate in the Historical Walk, a joint-school activity organized by the Civil Engineering and Development Department. Participants had benefited a great deal through listening to Dr. Ting Sun Pao's riveting briefing about the evolutionary history of Central and Sheung Wan.

17 IKTMC students engaged in the letter-exchange programme with the college's sister school in Zhong Shan in the 2018/2019 school year. On top of offering real-life occasions for NCS students to try to write in Chinese for authentic communication, the programme had helped foster the development of new friendship between the cities.

Our 14 budding dramatists enjoyed watching the classical drama "The Count of Monte Cristo" on 1st March 2019 at Sai Wan Ho Civic Centre. Not only were our students impressed by the performance of AFTEC, but also the theme of the story.

'Oh, the show is really great! In the post-show debriefing session, I was guided to dig out the moral values the story has intended to convey, and to distinguish "vengeance" from "justice". The play is about the importance of striking a balance between vengeance and justice — we can't just pick a side based on biased opinions. We need to look at both sides and exercise critical and analytical thinking,' says Faiza from 3B, looking thoughtful.

Not only were the participants being offered the opportunity to engage in an intensive 2-hour workshop on Fridays, they were also invited to join a drama training camp before their stage performance.

From writing the screenplay to designing stage props and acting, more than 40 of our students had great fun at the theatre, while 20 of them further experienced the process of drama production from "page" to "stage". They staged their performance in August, 2019.





Mathematics

Specific teaching plans have been designed and activities carried out in the 2018/2019 school year, which included:

Teaching strategies

- Maths classes were split into groups for attaining a lower teacherstudent ratio.
- · To cater for individual needs
 - Students were steamed into groups based their assessed mathematical competence and the cognitive developmental stages they were in
 - Remedial and enhancement classes were afforded
 - Supplementary tailor-made learning materials and worksheets were designed
- Assorted teaching aids have been administered to aid students' conceptualization of theoretical concepts and to motivate them to learn
- Intensive practice in preparation for S.3 TSA
 - Reinforcement TSA exercises were assigned during school holidays
 - The formats and content adopted in papers for internal tests and examinations were made to be consistent with those of TSA
 - Exam-oriented preparatory courses were offered to S.3 after the end-of-year internal examination
- Preparation for the HKDSE for S.6
 - Remedial and enhancement classes were held after-school and on Saturdays
 - Additional classes were run and goal-oriented exercises assigned during the period of the HKDSE study-leave
 - Multiple sets of mock exam papers were prescribed for the consolidation of mathematical concepts and the familiarization with examination formats.

The highlight of the thematic week fell on the Quiz Competition, which was held on 22nd November. S.1 students' initiative in going up to the stage to take on the open-ended questions had impressed all the adjudicators. Students were to tackle open-ended questions centred on Social Sciences in the "open-ended question" session. In view

of the heavy cognitive demand on responding to questions of such a sort, students were given a one-week period for preparation. Post-activity evaluation revealed that such a student-centred and liberal approach of learning had helped tapped into learners unexplored potential.

IKTMC students embarked on a field trip at the Caritas Chan Chun Ha Field Studies Centre on Cheung Chau on 27th November. Themed on "Food Globalization", participants carried out field studies on the streets and alleys of the island. It was a fruitful exploratory-learning experience

Two rounds of teacher-student debates were held during lunch time. Two separate motions were introduced for each occasion: the first being 'Is Lantau Vision Tomorrow a worthwhile investment?', while 'Talking about raising the next generation at present Hong Kong, one child only is better than more than one' the second. The events called into the debaters' analytical abilities to justify and validate their propositions.

Most of the participants were the youngsters and senior citizens in the community. They gave extremely positive feedback in the post-event evaluation, not least to the devotion demonstrated by the tutors of the workshops.

Career & Guidance

Having considered students' aspirations may fall into a broad spectrum, the Career and Guidance Department has run an assortment of careeroriented activities to foster students' all-round development. The underlying goals of those activities lied in guiding students to make a more informed choice on the post-secondary study path they are to opt for, or on the career path they are to take.

Junior Forms (S.1-S.3)

Career guidance centred on fostering self-discovery, teamwork building, and leadership development. Programmes were designed to facilitate the realization of one's academic or unacademic potential.

- Career star booklet (S.1 & S.2)
 - The booklet has been a log for charting a student's progress in life-planning in the course of his 6-year secondary school life.
- Peer-mentoring on the selection of HKDSE Elective Subjects (S.3)

These were occasions in which subject representatives from senior forms (S.4 & S.5) would offer counselling and advice to junior form students (S.3) before the latter declared their HKDSE electives. The sessions aimed at helping S.3 to orient towards declaring the HKDSE electives which they would show a genuine interest in

· Planning With Purpose - Financial Literacy (S.3)


