School Ethos and Support for Students

The Discipline and Counseling Committee aims to nurture students to become more self-reflective and self-disciplined, leading them to become good and successful citizens in the future. Learning and Teaching

Cultural harmony

Our college promotes cultural harmony among children of Chinese origin and those from ethnic minorities in Hong Kong. We welcome not only local students but also newly arrived children to apply for admission to our school. We provide Chinese and non-Chinese students with numerous opportunities to interact with one another on campus. Through mutual understanding, they can learn to live peacefully with each other while improving their fluency in English and Cantonese.

Whole-school Language Policy

In addition to Chinese and English languages, our college offers Putonghua, Urdu and Nepali languages to S1 to S3 students. According to our language policy, students are only allowed to communicate in Cantonese, Putonghua or English while on school campus.

Support for non-Chinese students

Our school provides additional support for NCS students to facilitate their learning of Chinese. This support includes after-school programmes to learn Chinese; the appointment of additional teacher(s)/ teaching assistant(s) to support NCS students' in learning Chinese; arranging intensive Chinese learning and teaching modes (such as pull-out learning or split-class/ group learning), developing school-based Chinese Language curriculum and/or adapting learning and teaching materials, organizing cultural integration activities, and hiring additional manpower and/ or translation/ interpretation services to facilitate the communication with parents.

Support for students coming from the mainland China

Additional Cantonese and English classes are arranged for the students from the mainland China, so that they can effectively cope with the study in Hong Kong.

Inclusive Education

Our Student Support Team (SST) is based on the Person-Centered Approach to support students who have special educational needs. We aim to promote great outcomes and progress in learning for every student. We provide early identification of students' needs through professional diagnosis and counselling. We support students in need through individual educational plans, classroom learning support, subject tuition, homework and assessment adjustments, etc. These measures enhance their enthusiasm for learning.

The Student Support Team (SST) arranges auxiliary and developmental activities, such as social groups, peer counseling groups, and speech training groups for students to enhance their self-confidence and social skills. In addition, our team also provides many different types of talent groups, inclusive activities, and competitions for students to participate in, so that they can develop their potential and enhance their ability to accept others' differences. Ultimately, this helps them develop themselves in all aspects.

After the activity, social workers and teachers led the students to conduct a debriefing session to let them understand that cooperation and concentration are important to completing tasks.

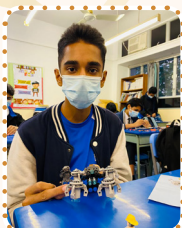

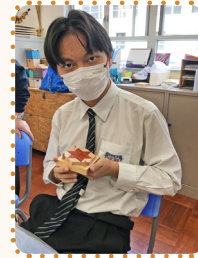

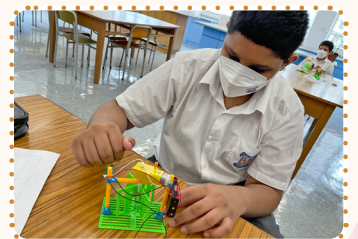
STEAM Activities

A new school-based STEAM curriculum has been implemented for S1 in this academic year. The aim is to strengthen students' ability to integrate and apply knowledge and skills. The curriculum prepares our students to meet the world's need for scientific and technological innovation.

The class activities expose and train students in STEAM through hands-on learning activities and experiments such as building automatic revolving door, vacuum cleaner, hand-charged car and Magdeburg hemispheres. It allows student to build a strong foundation in STEAM and develop problem solving skills gradually in the future.

IT programmes such as VR 360 course and metaverse taste workshop were arranged by the computer department outside the classroom so as to enhance students' interest in STEAM education.

Museum visits and interdisciplinary learning activities

In September, we arranged Form 6 students to visit Tai Kwun, to let them understand more about this declared monument. We also cooperated with the Mathematics Department to allow students to complete different learning activities while visiting.

Education Bureau School-based Support Program

This year, the Chinese Department participated in the School-based Support Program of the Education Bureau, and cooperated with the supporting teachers trying to integrate Chinese cultural elements into the school-based curriculum. In addition to text comprehension, we also arranged the Secondary 1 students to Shau Kei Wan for a deeper understanding of this characteristic community; while the Secondary 2 students tried to make a simple version of flower plaques by themselves.



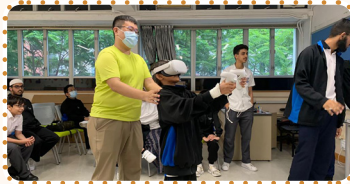

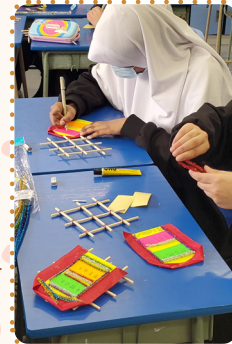

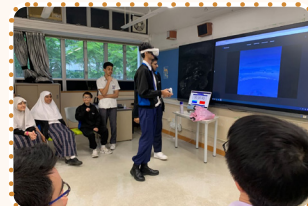

Mathematics

A number of specific teaching plans and activities were carried out in this school year. They were as follows:

Teaching strategy

1 Students' learning effectiveness as priority

Math classes are divided into small groups with the most appropriate teacher-student ratio across all forms.

2 Cater individual needs

- To acknowledge different learning needs, all students were allocated to groups according to respective competence and developmental stages in Mathematics.
- Provide remedial and enhancement classes after school to needed students.
- Tailor-made learning materials were designed to facilitate learning effectiveness.

3 HKDSE preparations for S6 students

- To facilitate value-add in HKDSE result, remedial and enhancement strategies were applied in senior forms simultaneously.
- Special classes are provided for the students after school in order to boost for even better results.
- Extra classes and intensive exercises were given during study period.
- Provide students with ample quantity of question bank with a specific target and clear objectives.
- To enhance the effectiveness of learning, tailor-made e-learning video episodes are available to facilitate revision on and off the line.

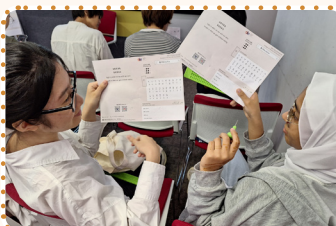
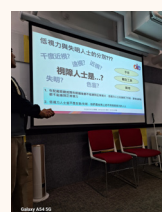
7. Capacity Building Scheme for Secondary School Teacher (by the Hong Kong Polytechnic University "PolyU")

Since last year, our school has become one of the core institutes in PolyU's Capacity Building Scheme and completed two Service-learning projects with PolyU together over the last summer.

7.1 Artificial Intelligence X Object Recognition: STEM education

Our students and teachers joined a series of workshops including a 3-hour Pre-Service Activity called Dialogue in the Dark Experience and 12-hour Secondary School Training Workshop & Preparation taught by PolyU students. They learned immersive experience on how visually

impaired people live and produced an A.I. object recognition system for the visually impaired using beginner-friendly online platforms.

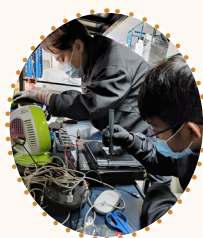
