## Learning and Teaching

### **School-based curriculum**

Our College uses student centred teaching approach, cooperative learning, mass lectures and graded worksheets, etc. to cater for the diverse needs, interest, and abilities of learners and help them develop generic skills.

A school-based Chinese Curriculum is designed for Non-Chinese speaking students in order to prepare them for the IGCSE, GCE Chinese Exam or HKDSE Chinese Exam.

In junior forms, our College focuses on building a firm foundation in the core subjects, Chinese, English and Mathematics.

Few native English-speaking teachers (NET) are employed to teach English and our College fosters English speaking environment by encouraging students from different cultural backgrounds to communicate in English.

In addition, after-school remedial classes are arranged for junior form students to foster a solid foundation in their junior secondary education.

In senior forms, our College aims at providing a board based HKDSE curriculum to develop students' potential.

#### S5 and 6 extra classes

In every academic year, the S5 and S6 students start their classes in mid August. Moreover, S5 and S6 students are arranged with an additional 10<sup>th</sup> lesson each day after school. This aims at helping the S5 and S6 students to achieve better results in the HKDSE.

## Inclusive Education

## Whole School Approach to Support Diverse Student Learning

Our school implements the "Whole School Approach" to inclusive education, collaborating with the Student Support Committee and various subject teachers to address the diversity of student learning needs. The Chinese and Mathematics subjects group students based on their learning abilities. This strategy allows teachers to cater for the learning differences while facilitating student learning.

The Committee provides professional assessments and counseling for students in need, which includes services from speech therapists, occupational therapists, educational psychologists, and school social workers. This enables the early identification of student needs. The Committee develops individual educational plans for students, offers classroom learning support, conducts after school tutorial groups, and adjusts homework and assessments to support student learning.

To promote holistic development, the Committee arranges activities such as social groups, peer tutoring groups, and speech training group for students who require assistance. These activities aim to enhance their confidence and social skills. Additionally, the Committee provides opportunities for various experiential learning groups, inclusive activities, and participation in different types of competitions to help students unleash their potential.

## Promotion of Reading

#### **Promotion of Reading:**

In Chinese saying: "A house without books is like a room without windows" to emphasize the importance of reading. In addition, the first message revealed by Allah in the Holy Quran started with "Iqra" - "Read". Reading is very important in learning, learning to read and reading to learn are the keys to success in self-directed learning. Our College organizes a series of activities to promote reading, including:

## **Morning Reading Programme**

The School Library has organized the "Morning Reading Programme" every Monday during the class teacher period to encourage students to read. Students read the Young Post during the Morning Reading Time to enhance their understanding of Hong Kong, the Mainland, and the world.

## **Reading Resources**

Students can access both books and e-books through different electronic reading devices - such as Kindle and Kobo - in the library, which offers more options to enhance 4 their interest in reading.

## **E-learning Platforms**

Additionally, the library has equipped itself with several e-learning platforms, such as i-Learner, HKedcity, and Rainbow, to enhance their overall reading horizons.

## **B**-learning

To support the implementation of the e-learning program, we have outfitted all classrooms with interactive smartboards and equipped our Multimedia Learning Center (MMLC) with iMac computers. Additionally, students have developed the habit of using online learning platforms or software, such as Google Classroom, Kahoot, and GeoGebra, etc. for interaction and learning.

To further enrich our students' exposure to emerging technologies, we have introduced several new eLearning platforms this year. PREFACE was utilized to help students create their own unique NFT artworks, deepening their understanding of blockchain technology and digital assets. CoSpaces allowed students to explore coding and design within a virtual reality environment, sparking their creativity and problem-solving skills. Additionally, our PE students benefited from "Learning Fun.com", which provided them with engaging theories, skill-building exercises, and data analysis tools to support their Physical Education.

## Chinese Language

## **Education Bureau School-based Support Program**

This year, the Chinese Department participated in the School-based Support Program, "Supporting Non-Chinese Speaking Students in Learning Chinese" Learning Community for Secondary Chinese Language Teachers organized by the Education Bureau.

Our Panel head of the Chinese Department, Miss LO, was invited to be a Resource Teacher in the Language Learning Support Section to support NCS learning and teaching of Chinese Language. Through meetings and collaboration with other curriculum leaders, she explored new ideas in teaching.

We aimed to integrate Chinese cultural elements into the school-based curriculum. For example, a Cultural Walk in Chai Wan" was organized for S4 students, allowing them to gain a deeper understanding of the Chai Wan community. After that, they also joined the filming competition to showcase their learning.

This year, we collaborated with the English Department to arrange the S3 students to visit the Flagstaff House Museum of Tea Ware. In addition to learning about the premise, which is a declared monument, the program also introduced students to traditional tea-drinking culture in China. Furthermore, students were arranged to enjoy an English Drama show about the traditional Chinese story "Romance of the Three Kingdoms".

- 2. The flipped classroom model has been commonly used in mathematics classes. It helps increase independent active learning and develop higher-order thinking skills.
- 3. HKDSE preparation quizzes were conducted throughout S6 study period to help students familiarize themselves with and prepare for the HKDSE.

### **External Competitions**

Students participated in various mathematics competitions to broaden their exposure and refine their mathematical skills. These competitions provided opportunities for students to



showcase their abilities, engage in challenging problemsolving tasks, and further develop their proficiency in mathematics.


